Builders rarely replace an existing model with a smaller one, but that's what Beneteau has just done.

Although the Oceanis 31 has not been discontinued at the time of writing, by all accounts the new 30.1 is destined to take over this slot in the size range.

There's a reason why the new arrival is slightly smaller: she's designed to be trailable. You

wouldn't keep a boat like this in your drive, hitch her up behind the family saloon and launch at the nearest slipway for a weekend's sailing, but her vital statistics open up all sorts of options denied to larger and heavier boats. Despite her relatively narrow beam there's a

surprising amount of space below decks. A pronounced chine running from stem to stern keeps the waterline reasonably slim while maximising volume inside the hull, the beamiest point of which is at the transom. The absence of a backstay allows the twin wheels (if you choose them instead of the standard tiller, as most owners inevitably will) to be right at the stern

to create a large clear cockpit.

Keel options are deep or shallow fin, a deep lifting keel, or a centreplate that retracts into a stub keel and is paired with shoes on

the twin rudders meaning it's possible for her to dry out unaided.

As long as the 30.1 sails as she should, Beneteau, Finot-Conq and Nauta (deck and interior design) have come up with a boat that looks set to fly off the shelves.

The Bente 39 has what you might call a streamlined doghouse. Inside at the nav seat you have space for electronics and a view out in every direction as well as down into the galley and saloon.

Conceived as a fast offshore cruiser with racing potential, she has a T-bulb fin, twin rudders and hull lines from Judel and Vrolijk that suggest she won't hang around. The owner of boat No.2 is competing in some Fastnet qualifiers this season so we will soon see the boat in action.

She's quite a handsome boat in the modern style, with a good cockpit, coamings that are comfortable to sit on when the boat's heeled, raised bulwarks for security on deck – and a very competitive price tag, which makes you wonder how the builder does it.

This eagerly awaited addition to Grand Soleil's Performance range was expected to be shown in Düsseldorf but wasn't quite ready in time. She will now make her first public appearance at Genoa in September.

Slotting in between the GS 43 and 58, she looks like a potent performer with her light, easily driven hull and plenty of sail balanced by a T-bulb fin. She's no strippedout race boat, however: a quick glance below decks makes that clear.
